² One of the nine counties, or one of the districts 'beyond the limits of location'. Licenses to 'depasture' stock were formalised under the 'Act for regulating the Sale of Waste Land belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colonies [1842 and 1846], the latter sometimes called the 'Squatters' Act of 1846-7'. The principle of sale by auction was maintained, the lands were to be surveyed before being put up for sale, and the upset price was fixed at twenty shillings an acre. Special blocks of more than 20,000 acres, covering the Kinghorne runs, could be sold before survey, by private contract at not less than the upset price. The classification of lands divided the colony into (a) settled districts; (b) intermediate districts; and (c) unsettled districts. Crown leases were granted for various terms in each of the three divisions for pastoral purposes only; the lessee could at any time purchase the freehold at the upset price of £1 an acre, and on the expiration of the term retained pre-emptive

rights at the same price over all or any part of the land. The Kinghornes retained these rights until they sold their runs in the 1850s: ABS, *Land Tenure and Settlement*.
